Volunteer Award

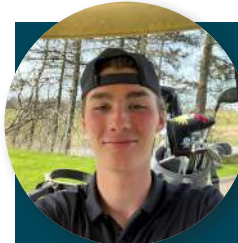
Lily's work this summer focused on water temperatures in the Ranch reach. Her work builds on the project that was launched in collaboration with anglers last year to monitor temperature using data-loggers in Harriman State Park. Lily visited each of the 17 sites every week to download data, which is added to the HFF website. The project helps HFF learn more about temperature variability on the Ranch, and find ways to reduce the effects of temperature on our fisheries.

Hunter spent the summer monitoring, repairing, and maintaining HFF's riparian fence along Last Chance and Wood Road 16. The Future is Bright:

The Next 40 Years



At HFF, we recognize that we stand on the shoulders of giants. The foundation for our current achievements was built 40 years ago by the foresight and dedication of the founders, board, and staff who came before us. Every project, every success, has been decades in the making.

That is part of what makes our work now so crucial. Every step we take today will set up the Henry's Fork and future stewards to face the challenges the next 40 years will bring.

UNIQUE CHALLENGES

Climate, drought, water quality, and changes in hatches are giving us a preview of what's ahead. That's why anglers, partners, and HFF are coming together to launch efforts that can investigate and address the most critical issues the river faces.

Here are a few of the projects and programs aiming to tackle the next generation of challenges.

DIRTT: Developing Infrastructure to Reduce Temperature and Turbidity

The DIRTT Plan might be the most comprehensive of all the work coming down the pipeline. This umbrella plan investigates a whole host of potential solutions to some of the river's biggest challenges. From "high tech" fixes such as engineering and infrastructure to pull cool water from the depths of Island Park Reservoir, or to prevent West End sediment from reaching Island Park Dam, or to pump oxygen into trout habitat, to "nature-based" solutions like tributary restoration and aquifer recharge to ensure that cooler water enters the Ranch, this plan is looking at it all.



VOICE OF THE RIVER

While not a "new" program, HFF's role as Voice of the River will be as vital as ever in the face of increasing development pressure on wastewater facilities, water supply and already increasing phosphorus levels in the river itself. These issues could pose some of the greatest risks to the fishery's health in recent memory, and will require a coordinated effort by all who care for this river and its watershed.

RANCH WATER TEMPERATURE MONITORING

Launched in 2023 in coordination with anglers, extensive [monitoring of water temperatures](#) throughout the Ranch will not only pinpoint areas of concern, but will inform where strategies developed in the DIRTT Plan can be most effective in actively cooling Ranch temperatures for trout and insects.

RIVER CONDITIONS WEBSITE

HFF's suite of online data empower angler decision-making. From home and from the river, anglers can pull up



current water temperatures, streamflows, hatch timing, and more. Is there off-color water coming out of the reservoir and making the Box Canyon water shades of brown? Now you can check in [real-time](#).



Tackling these new efforts does not take away from the Foundation's tried-and-true work. To ensure a bright future, riparian fencing, river access, fish passage, educational programs, and unprecedented water conservation through our Farms & Fish and Precision Water Management programs must all continue. The dedicated and capable staff and Board of the Henry's Fork Foundation will make sure they do.
